SELECTION CRITERIA/ REQUIREMENTS

The Yuba-Sutter Leadership program accepts approximately 12 individuals after an extensive application review process by volunteer leaders, Yuba-Sutter Chamber staff, and the alumni committee. Applicants must work in the Yuba-Sutter area. A conscious effort is made to select participants who represent a cross-section of the community in terms of experience and occupation to build a diverse class with various backgrounds.

IDEAL CANDIDATES INCLUDE INDIVIDUALS WHO EXHIBIT:

- A strong interest in serving as a leader for our community
- A passion for supporting the community demonstrated through past involvement in community activities
- Currently holds a leadership position or demonstrates a potential for advancement into leadership positions within private-sector corporations, community-based organizations, government and/or public office
- An ability to contribute meaningfully to class discussions through individual life experiences

ALL PARTICIPANTS ARE REQUIRED TO MEET THE FOLLOWING COMMITMENTS:

- Attend an overnight retreat, September 7-8
- Attend at least 8 of the 9 regular monthly sessions held the third Thursday of each month from September-June at various locations throughout Yuba-Sutter.
- Complete homework assignments that serve to enhance the participant experience.
- Actively participate in the class community service project, which will require additional time commitments (the extent of which depends on the project chosen by the class)
